- All accepted abstracts (short abstracts, submitted before 31 March 2010, for extended abstracts: see next step) will be published permanently on [www.FogConference.org](http://www.FogConference.org).
- Authors are encouraged to submit extended abstracts before 30 June 2010. An extended abstract will replace the respective short abstract. It will be printed in the conference proceedings and will be published on [www.FogConference.org](http://www.FogConference.org). If a short abstract is not replaced, it will be printed and published.
- Contributions focusing on meteorology or climatology may be submitted to a special issue (or a book) of *Pure and Applied Geophysics* ([www.springer.com/birkhauser/geo+science/journal/24](http://www.springer.com/birkhauser/geo+science/journal/24)). They will be subject to the regular review process. The anticipated date of publication is March 2011.
- Up to 7 contributions with broader subject will be selected by the scientific committee for a special issue of *Erdkunde* ([www.giub.uni-bonn.de/erdkunde](http://www.giub.uni-bonn.de/erdkunde)). They will undergo the journal's peer review process. The anticipated date of publication is April-June 2011.
