Putting Geosciences back on the European Agenda

Recently, the geosciences have frequently hit the front pages. The Cassini-Huygens and Mars Express space missions provided spectacular images of our planetary system. Current debates on rapid climate change make the headlines almost daily. Although through enormous loss of life the Sumatra catastrophe has provided enormous visibility.

2006 is the year in which the next European Community Framework programme will be decided, we think it is essential for the Geosciences to underline some of our achievements and long term projects at the upcoming EGU General Assembly in Vienna.

As the incoming president of the European Geosciences Union, John LUDDEN, with Enric BANDA, a past president, will organise a Union session entitled **"Putting Geosciences back onto the European Agenda"** at the upcoming EGU meeting in Vienna Tuesday. The aims of this Union session are to present the current state of major geoscience initiatives in Europe and to define the steps required to enhance major multi-national geoscience programmes as part of the European Research Ara.

- British Geological Survey, UK: Natural Hazards and risks the third and fourth dimensions.
