

Kipp & Zonen Award for Boundary Layer Meteorology

Kipp & Zonen, manufacturer of meteorological instruments, is proud to announce its **Award for Boundary Layer Research**. It shall be awarded to an aspiring young scientist presenting an outstanding research paper on Boundary Layer Meteorology at a conference. The Award was launched in the year 2005, when Kipp & Zonen celebrated its 175th anniversary. In 2010, the Award will be given at the **10th EMS Annual Meeting & 8th European Conference on Applied Climatology (ECAC) in Zürich, Switzerland.**

The Award

The award consists of a prize money of 1000 Euro, expenses for travel and accommodation and an Awards certificate.

Requirements for the 2010 Award

The following set of requirements applies:

- 1. Candidates can come from any country.
- 2. Candidates shall be under 35 years of age on the first of January 2010.
- 3. The Award shall be given to a scientist presenting an excellent paper at the 10th EMS Annual Meeting/8th ECAC conference.
- 4. The encouraged field of research is Boundary Layer Meteorology and specifically related to solar radiation (UV, Visible and FIR) and direct effects.

Application procedure

- 1) Submit your abstract at meetings.copernicus.org/ems2010, and tick the box "Kipp & Zonen Award for Boundary Layer Meteorology" in the abstract submission tool. Please note that abstract submission with Award application will close on Friday, 09 April 2009.
- 2) Send the documents listed under (i) and (ii) to

awardapplication@emetsoc.org

no later than 09 April 2010.

Documents (i) and (ii) must be provided in pdf-format.

- (i) a short curriculum vitae
- (ii) a document to determine the age of the candidate.

Presentation of the Award

The Award, including a cheque and a certificate, will be presented during the Opening Session at the 10th EMS Annual Meeting and 8th ECAC on Monday, 13 September 2010.

Selection process

The select committee consists of Joop Mees (Kipp&Zonen, The Netherlands), Anna Maria Sempreviva (ISAC-CNR, Italy) and Jenni Ruahala (FMI, Finnland). The evaluation of applications is based on the interest and innovation content of the submitted abstract and the profile of the candidate.
